

SIND ORDINANCE NO.XXXIII OF 1984

THE SIND COTTON CONTROL (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1984

[18th October, 1984]

An Ordinance to amend the Sind Cotton Control Ordinance, 1966.

WHEREAS the Federal Shariat Court has directed to make certain amendments in the law relating to cotton control; **Preamble.**

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Sind Cotton Control Ordinance, 1966, in the manner hereinafter appearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Proclamation of the fifth day of July, 1977, and the Provisional Constitution Order, 1981, the Governor of Sind is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance :-

1. (1) This Ordinance may be called the Sind Cotton Control (Amendment) Ordinance, 1984.

Short title and commencement.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. In the Sind Cotton Control Ordinance, 1966, in section 7, after sub-section (3), the following new sub-section shall be inserted:-

Amendment of section 7 of West Pakistan Ordinance XX of 1966.

“(3-A) Any person aggrieved by an order passed under sub-section (3) may, within seven days of the order, prefer an appeal to Government, whose decision shall be final:

Provided that no order shall be passed in appeal unless the appellant has been afforded an opportunity of being heard.
